- Hand Hygiene between patients





PERSON ADMITTED UNDER INVESTIGATION AND /OR POSITIVE

Aerosolized procedures

Respirators (N-95, PAPR, or equivalent) **ARE ONLY INDICATED DURING PROCEDURES WHICH ARE AEROSOL-INDUCING.** Examples: obtaining a nasopharyngeal swab, endotracheal intubation, mechanical ventilation, aspiration of a tonsillar abscess etc. These patients require placement in

Negative airflow room, special isolation sign, gloves, gown, eye protection, N95/PAPR









SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS



Only essential personnel should enter this room





Visitors, check with staff before entry



Hand Hygiene In & Out of Room



Surgical mask required



Wear eye protection (face shield or goggles)



Gown



Gloves



Surgical mask on patient if out of room



KEEP DOOR CLOSED

When performing aerosolizing procedures, a fit tested N-95 with eye protection or PAPR is required



Staff are to utilize the N95 mask until it is visibly soiled. Inspect the mask throughout the shift
